Like other laser systems, the HPL™ technology painlessly triggers the hair follicle, is then absorbed by the hair shaft and then disables hair growth. With the device, simply plug the base to an electrical outlet and utilize the applicator to point to targeted areas and at the press of a button, the light energy will go off and penetrate the skin.
